ABOUT THE EXHIBITION

Speaking and Silence are often in conflict with different interests. When, why and what women express depends on many factors and is also country- and culture-specific. Values are an important reference, as is safety. It's a thin line whether the raised voices are resonant and impactful or fall silent again.

The World Heritage Site Aapravasi Ghat and the historic building of Cerne Docks form the frame of reference for the exhibition 'VOICES'. Only on the background of history, its diverse culture and ethnicity the specific of Mauritian women can be understood.

The huge halls are – at the first sight – inhospitable and dark. Wind and weather whistle through cracks and holes in the roof. Birds fly through glassless windows. These spaces are filled with thoughts and feelings of women surround us and share with us different facets of women's life. The 'COLUMN OF RESPECT' symbolizes the concentrated power of courage that illuminates the dark. Mauritian Women conquer the space with sorrow and pride. These voices are out in the light, but many are still silent. It raises the question of how the concerns and wishes can be heard and implemented and how more women can be encouraged to get involved in Mauritian society.

ABOUT 'WOMEN IN THE DARK'

The international art project WOMEN IN THE DARK about discrimination and violence against women was initiated in 2016 by Franziska Greber. In collaboration with organizations in each country, women get the opportunity to write their experiences, pain, wishes and hopes on white shirts (in India on Dupattas/Scarfs) with red permanent markers.

So far eight countries are participating: Zimbabwe, Seychelles, China, India, Switzerland, Chile, Germany and Mauritius. The writing flows into the artistic process, which focuses on the messages of women's voices and leads to various installations that are shown to the public. Reaching this goal is only possible in collaboration with organizations and local women that are well-connected in the respective country. Project-Representatives oversee the project in their countries and communities. They are the basis for a successful implementation in the specific culture.

WOMEN IN THE DARK consist of 4 phases:

Cooperation

A strong network and contact with women that might participate are key elements for organizations to collaborate.

Writing Process

The writing process with the women is the responsibility of the collaborating organizations.

Exhibitions

The written shirts, texts, photos and video-documentations are shown as art installations to the public.

Sustainability

All, in the process developed materials are available to the organizations for further use.

Franziska Greber, Switzerland

For the past four decades, she has been devoting herself to studies and projects related to domestic and other forms of violence and discrimination, Human- and Women's Rights.

She was Co-Head of the Intervention Center against domestic violence at the Directorate of Justice and Home Affairs in the Canton of Zurich, worked as a psychotherapist, taught at Universities and Colleges, had written numerous articles in academic journals and books and was a Speaker at UN Events in Geneva and Vienna.

Franziska Greber was involved in many Theater Projects (one in a Swiss prison), worked as a Script-consultant for a documentary movie about depression and for a fictional movie about domestic violence.

In 2016 she put her focus on Women's Rights – with using art – and initiated the international art project 'WOMEN IN THE DARK' in Zimbabwe.

Her artworks are based on a variety of Media, including Installations, Photography, Videos and Texts. She had several Solo- and Group Exhibitions in India, China and Switzerland.
